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I must start by apologising for the lateness of this newsletter and for the slimmer edition. Personal and other factors have conspired against me this time but hopefully the next issue will be back up to strength.

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### Reunion 2018

As you will have read in the Annual General Meeting resumé in the last Newsletter, the dates of the 2018 reunion will be Friday 5<sup>th</sup> and Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> October. The Annual General Meeting will be at 13.30 on Friday and the service and parade will be at 10.45 for 11.00 on the Saturday. The major change will be that there will be NO dinner on the Friday evening. This is not a decision we came to lightly, in fact we thought long and hard about it and explored various options but last year we only had 62 for the dinner, of which only 6 were RNPS veterans, which fell well below a financial break even point. It has always been the case that the reunion should be self funding and not a drain on association funds. We are sure members will understand our reasoning and still continue to support us at the buffet after the service on the Saturday.

So, the programme for the reunion is -

- 1. Friday 5<sup>th</sup> October, the AGM will be held at the same venue as last year, Studio Theatre in Sparrows Nest Gardens at 13.30. This is the old theatre box office and is next to the new Italian Restaurant at the bottom of the park.
- 2. The service of remembrance will be at 11.00 on Sat. 6<sup>th</sup> Oct. (muster 10.45) in Belle Vue Park.
- 3. We will then continue after the service on Saturday in Sparrows Nest Gardens with "Sunset" outside the museum by the mast. There will be no march down from the memorial, we will just re-gather when everyone has had a chance to make their way down to the Nest and get their second wind.
- 4. After the parade is dismissed there will be a buffet in Giardino, the Italian Restaurant in the park but this is by TICKET ONLY at £12.00 per head please see booking form at the end of this newsletter.

Also, in the Sparrows Nest Gardens the Martello Cafe will be open during the day both Friday and Saturday.

#### Draw books

# Privacy statement

You have, no doubt seen or heard about the new GDPR rules that have just come in. GDPR stands for General Data Protection Regulation. The great package of souvenirs sent from Lowestoft to Joe Schwarzer (director of the Graveyard of the Atlantic museum) to hand out was well received. Joe was thrilled to receive the package and we had to try to decide how to disperse the gifts. We decided that the museum should keep a copy of the books and the remainder to those

The scarves were very popular and in demand so we handed those out very discreetly. We certainly raised our profile.

He had done some excellent research and had been in contact with some of the men from HMT Coventry City and I think HMT Norwich City back in the early 90's. He had some letters and photos from some of the men who served here on the trawlers. He gave 2 lectures on the
